



# Support for Newly-Arrived Ukrainians at NICE

Please note that availability of program enrollment will be dependent on staff capacity.

## Cash Assistance/Employment Services

Support finding employment, career coaching, and enrollment in a monthly cash assistance program until you are financially self-sufficient.

## Health Insurance Support

Enrollment in a health insurance program: TennCare (Medicaid) for families with minors, pregnant women, or Refugee Medical Assistance Program for adults with no minor children.

## Government Benefits Support

**Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (Food Stamps)** provides temporary food assistance.

**Families First program** provides temporary cash assistance, transportation, child care assistance, educational supports, job training, employment activities, and other support services.

## Health Case Management Programs

Case management services for eligible individuals requiring longer time for self-sufficiency, such as elders or those with medical issues. Services include: long-term case management, health and medical interventions, mental health interventions, and social adjustment services.

## Education Programs

**Youth Education:** Support for school enrollment, school orientation, and social adjustment in schools, as well as enrollment in youth summer camp.

**Adult Education:** English Language Classes and High School Diploma Equivalency Classes

## Immigration Services

Support filing Employment Authorization Documents and Social Security Cards. NICE staff can assess eligibility for permanent residency in the US, and provide services or refer to other trusted partners based on a case-by-case basis.
